- Political Action for Union Activists


Members can also access various supports, including family and childcare, and human rights accommodations. Meal per diems, travel expenses, and hotel

Local 527 Bargaining Updates

Ontario Public Service (OPS) Bargaining Survey

By now, OPS members of Local 527 in good standing should have received a link to the phase 1 bargaining survey. This survey is essential as the data collected will play a crucial role in shaping and influencing the eventual demand-setting survey. If you did not receive the link please reach out to us. Your participation is vital in ensuring that your collective voice is heard and that your demands are accurately represented.

Workplace Safety and Insurance Appeals Tribunal (WSIAT) Bargaining

After many delays and obstacles to bargaining due to the now-defunct Bill 124, the WSIAT bargaining team is looking forward to the resumption of bargaining. Tentative dates are scheduled for early October. The team appreciates the patience and support from members throughout this process, and looks forward to making progress on negotiating a new contract which meets the current and future needs of all WSIAT members.

Canadian Mental Health Association - Ontario Division (CMHA-ON)

The current CMHA-ON collective agreement expires on December 31, 2024. Please stay tuned for updates on the next steps in the bargaining process, which will include electing a bargaining team and surveying of members to determine priorities for demand setting and bargaining. Your active participation is crucial in shaping a collective agreement that meets your needs.











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
